R&J Seminar Process

To ensure consistent and first class standards of officiating, all R&J seminars throughout Australia shall be conducted under the direction of the BAI R&J Committee.

The seminars shall form part of the ongoing education and development of Australian R&J, and shall form part of the modules for attainment of R&J accreditation.

This process shall be read in conjunction with the R&J accreditation process.

Seminar responsibilities

All R&J seminars within Australian are the responsibility of the BAI R&J Committee and shall be conducted by:

- A member or members of the BAI R&J Committee, or
- The R&J Co-ordinator of a Member Association that has attended a seminar conducted by the BAI R&J Committee, or
- A representative so appointed by the R&J Co-ordinator who holds a minimum of national qualification.

Seminar facilitators

- **Member Association Level:**
 - A member or members of the BAI R&J Committee, or
 - The R&J Co-ordinator of a Member Association, or
 - A representative so appointed by the R&J Co-ordinator who holds a minimum of national qualification.
- **National Level:**
 - Two members of the BAI R&J Committee, or
 - Two AIBA qualified R&J.

Seminar frequencies

One seminar, as a minimum, shall be conducted yearly for, and attended by, all levels of R&J throughout Australia. The BAI R&J Committee will be notified of each seminar. Seminars are mandated prior to each examination.
