**Overview of Role**

The role of the Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) is to support and prepare Australia’s Olympic Boxing Team. In the absence of the Olympic Head Coach, the Assistant Coach (Men) will assume full responsibility of the team.

The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) will provide assistance to the Olympic Head Coach in planning, monitoring and conditioning all male National Team Members.

If Boxing receives **two coaching positions** for the 2012 London Olympic Games the occupant of this position if selected by the Australian Olympic Committee will attend the Olympic Games and be required to work with the whole team.

### **Job/Task Profile**

- The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) will be required to support the Olympic Head Coach and assist with the implementation of a competition and training program endorsed by BAI;
- be available for the commitments outlined below;
- assist with the monitoring of athlete performance;
- assist in overseeing the day to day training of boxers attending training camps and during the period the boxers are preparing for competition while in the Olympic Village;
- assist the Head Coach in providing advice to boxers in the corner during all competitions including the Olympic Games;
- travel with the Olympic representatives to international tournaments and be directly responsible to and follow all coaching programs developed by the Head Coach
- set an example to all selected boxers in terms of behaviour, dress and commitment
- monitor the performance of Olympic representatives as directed by the Head Coach;
- be available to attend BAI approved international tournaments;
- be available to attend BAI approved training camps recommended by the National Coach;
- be registered with an affiliated state organisation recognised by BAI; and
- be nominated by a BAI affiliated state association.

### **Skills, Attributes & Qualifications**

The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) will be required to possess:

- demonstrated interpersonal and communication skill;
- previous experience as an international coach and a demonstrated capacity to provide leadership and direction to boxers competing at major international tournaments;
- demonstrated well developed organisational skills;
- ability to supervise individual training programs for all selected Olympic representatives; and
- a current Level 1 or Level 2 coach accreditation by the Australian Sports Commission - Coaching and Officiating Unit or internationally recognised accreditation and an AIBA Coach Accreditation.

### **Commitments**

The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) will be required to commit to at least the major parts of the following:

- Australian Championships, Hobart (1-5 February 2012)
- Oceania Qualification Preparations, Canberra (13 February – 20 March 2012)
- Oceania Olympic Qualifiers, Canberra (20-25 March 2012)
- Australian Olympic Preparations, Canberra ( 1-7 April 2012)
- European Tour No.2, Russia, Serbia, Ukraine (7 April – 7 May 2012)
- Australian Olympic Preparations, Canberra (15 May – 10 July 2012)
- Final Olympic Preparations, Northern Ireland (10-24 July 2012)
- Olympic Games, England (24 July – 12 August 2012)

### **In-Competition & Village Structure**

The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) **is not guaranteed** a position on the Olympic Team. The person nominated for the position will only travel to the Olympics if Boxing receives a **quota of two coaches** and is selected by the Australian Olympic Committee.

The Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) role while in-competition will be:

- Reside within the Village
- Focus on the Male preparations
- Have daily verbal communication with the Olympic Head Coach & Section Manager on the male preparations
- Second all Men's Competitions.

### **Key Performance Indicators**

The Key Performance Indicators for the Olympic Assistant Coach (Men) are:

- Qualify eight men's boxers for the 2012 Olympic Games
- Provide 1 x Top 4 performance at the 2012 Olympic Games
